

The Pearl Talks: Streetcar Expansion Plans are Underway! by Bruce Levy, Pearl Resident

With doom and gloom dominating headlines and financial woes plaguing the planet, it's reassuring to know our little corner of the world is still chugging along and growing.

Pearl residents in the newer, northern reaches survived a harshweather holiday thanks partially to the opening of Safeway (making life quite convenient) and we can all now enjoy our own LA Fitness club and Bank of America branch.

Living in the northern end of the 'hood is now becoming a sustainable reality – the concept of a '20-minute neighborhood' fulfilled. Equally satisfying is the promise of our third park "The Fields" and the intriguing Centennial Mills development to begin construction next year. In the spring, The Portland Development Commission will host a public open house. Watch for announcements.

Expanding neighborhood connectivity, the anticipated Eastside Streetcar project will travel from downtown, through the Pearl; over the Broadway Bridge to OMSI. For Neighborhood Association has been meeting with streetcar planners, consultants and PDOT officials to help determine the optimal routing through the Pearl.

These citizens, led by knowledgeable chairwoman Ann Niles, have advocated for the Northrup option that utilizes as much of the existing track as possible.

Crucially, this option anticipates even more streetcar service to the Northwest District from Portland's

the past year, your Pearl District Eastside. It includes improved traffic circulation provisions, anticipating Lovejoy and Northrup Streets as a couplet in the Pearl. As a bonus, NW Marshall Street would become a major bicycle boulevard.

> Best of all, what this option immediately offers is twice the frequency of service to streetcar riders on 10th/11th Avenues! Furthermore, Pearl's northernmost the area - the area experiencing most new development – will be well served by this additional service, too.
