Invasive plant removal efforts: Garlic Mustard from the City of Portland, Bureau of Environmental Services

This spring, the City of Portland will work with several partners to stamp out garlic mustard along roads and streams, and in natural areas around northwest Portland. European settlers brought garlic mustard to North America, probably to use for food and medicine. But its threat to the environment far outweighs any medicinal or nutritional benefits.

Garlic mustard is a non-native, invasive plant that spreads by seed and rapidly displaces native vegetation. Garlic mustard roots release chemicals into the soil that inhibit growth of nearby plants.

The city will hire licensed



contractors to spot-spray garlic mustard along roadways in northwest Portland this April and May. See the Garlic Mustard Treatment Locations table at www.portlandonline.com/bes/garlicmustard for spraying locations along roadways.

In April and May, the city will also spot-spray garlic mustard along trails in Forest Park. The city is also working with Clean Water Services to spray garlic mustard near streams that flow into the Tualatin River. Crews will pull garlic mustard in the same areas this June.
